Who, what, when, why, where and how?

- The Anglo-Saxon age in Britain was from around AD410 to 1066.
- They were a mix of tribes from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands. The three biggest were the Angles, the Saxons and the Jutes. The land they settled in was 'Angle-land', or England.
- The Anglo-Saxons came to England to fight, farm, live and were actually invited to help protect from the Scots, who were trying to invade.
- Britain wasn't ruled by one person and the Anglo-Saxons were not united. They invaded as many different tribes and each took over different parts of Britain. One part was East-Anglia, where we live today.


