

# Local History: Norwich



## KEY VOCABULARY

Rebellion– An act of armed resistance to an established
Black Death- The great epidemic of a disease thought to be bubonic plague, which killed a large proportion of the population of Europe.
Settle– Sit or come to rest at a specific location.
Motte and Bailey- A highly-protected stone-fortified keep (the motte) is accompanied by an enclosed courtyard protected by sharpened wooden stakes (the bailey).
Baedeker raid- In 1942 the German Air Force launched a series of destructive air raids against historic towns and cities in Britain.
Landmark– An object or feature of a landscape or town
Mayor– The head of a town, borough, or county council, elected by council members and generally having purely ceremonial duties.

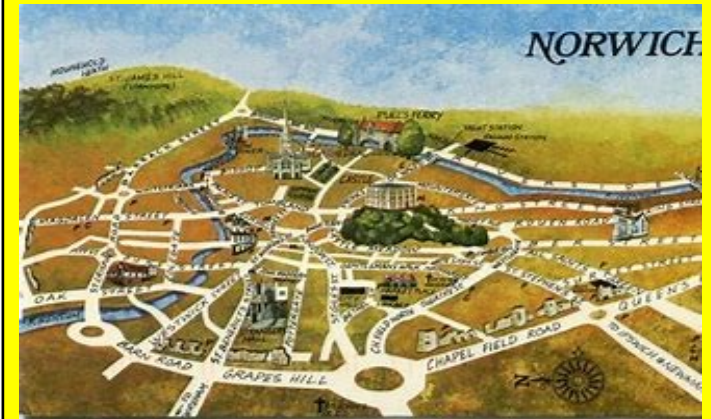
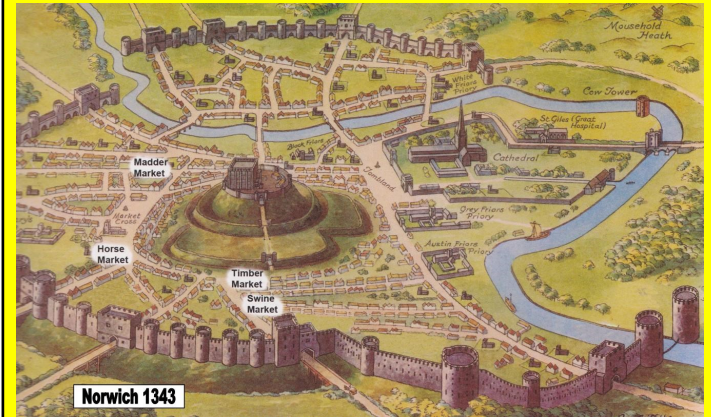
