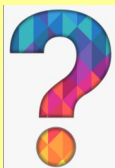

What is The Trinity?

|  | Baptism | A Christian sacrament marked by ritual use of water and admitting the recipient to the Christian community. |
|  | Father | In Christianity, God the Father is the first Person of the Trinity, which also includes his Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. |
|  | Son | In Christianity the word 'Son' is also a description of Jesus as the second person of the Trinity . |
|  | Gospel | The teachings of the Christian religion. |
|  | Incarnation | This literally means “to become flesh” or “to be given a body” and for Christians it describes what happened when God was born as a human being called Jesus. |
|  | Salvation | This is the act of delivering (or keeping away) from evil or saving from sin. |
|  | Trinity | The Trinity is the belief that God is three separate persons but is still a single God: God the Father, God the Son (Jesus Christ) and God the Holy Spirit. |
|  | monotheistic | The belief that there is only one God. |
| | God | In Christianity and other monotheistic religions, the creator and ruler of the universe and source of all moral authority; the supreme being. |

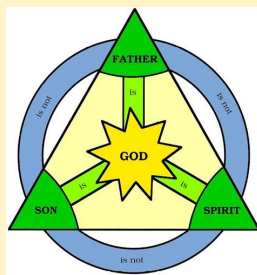
Information we will learn:

-God: Christian belief in one God, who is described as Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit).

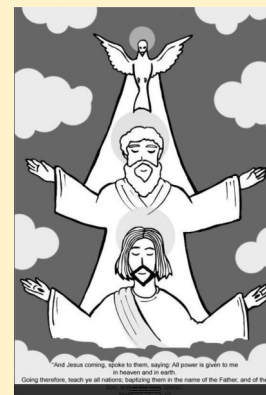
-Jesus: As God incarnate, also known as the Son of God.
