T	Crucifixion	It was a method of capital punishment where the victim is tied or nailed to a parge wooden cross and left there until they died.
Easter Sunday	Easter Sunday	It is the most important festival in the Christian calendar. It celebrates Jesus rising from the dead three days after he was executed.
	Eternal Life	Christians believe that this is a gift from God for those who believe in Jesus Christ. Christians believe that life continues after death.
With the same of t	Forgiveness	Forgiveness is an important concept in Christianity. They make a conscious effort to forgive and let go of feelings that come with bearing a grudge against someone.
Y	Good Friday	This is observed on the Friday before Easter Sunday. On this day Christians commemorate the suffering and death on the cross of Jesus Christ.
Matthew Mark Luke John	Gospel	These are in the New Testament and are the four Biblical narratives about Jesus' life and death.
	Redemption	In Christianity it is the belief that humans can be saved from sin and redeemed through the actions of Jesus Christ.

-Jesus: As God incarnate, also known as the Son of God. Christian belief that Jesus fulfilled prophecies about the Messiah.

-Salvation: Gospel accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection and the various interpretations of these accounts in terms of the meaning of salvation (e.g. forgiveness, sacrifice, redemption).

-Textual theology: consideration of genre, author, content, reliability and audience in relation to the Gospels and resurrection of Jesus .

-Festivals: the diverse ways in which people celebrate festivals such as Easter.
